The Society would like to ask any chapter that is considering razing their present home to contact us so that we may take a visual record for the university archives of your respective university and in Champaign-Urbana, at least, allow preservationists to come in to help you salvage as many artifacts as possible. Preservation Tips

Preserving a Greek-letter organization's history can be a daunting task. History is often thought of as what has happened in the past. It is difficult for chapter members to think that what is happening in the present will someday be considered history. Current chapter members are living the history of the chapter and its important that the events of each academic year be preserved for posterity. Where does a chapter start?

Some of the items that can help tell a story of the history of an organization are minute books, membership lists, fraternity magazines, chapter newsletters, scrapbooks, and assorted communications (letters, mailings, flyers, programs, etc.). It is important to chronicle on a yearly basis the membership roll, philanthropic efforts, social events, awards, and the improvements in chapter housing.

It is essential that these items be stored in a dry, protected environment. It was heartbreaking to see an Illinois chapter whose nearly full run of the fraternity magazine was destroyed by a flood in the basement room where the bound volumes were stored.

With more and more communication being done via computer and e-mail, it is imperative that a chapter member be designated to print and preserve a copy of important information.

A committee can be assigned to take care of this task. Members of this committee should be carefully chosen and each member should have a love of history and a deep desire to preserve it for future chapter members.

If the chapter does not have the resources or the wherewithal to take on such a large task, the University of Illinois Student Life and Culture Archives can help. The Archives are a wonderful spot to deposit some of the chapter's historic items themselves or duplicates of the items, if the chapter wishes to keep items in their own archives.

The items sought by the Archives are: constitutions, charters, and by-laws; minutes and reports of meetings and committees; membership lists; organizational histories; publications and publicity material -newsletters, brochures, event programs and booklets; officers' files - correspondence and memoranda (incoming and outgoing) and subject files concerning projects, activities, and functions; scrapbooks; and audio-visuals: photographs, films, and video tapes.

Question in Regard to Fund-Raising?

Brian Murphy, the new Alpha Delta Phi alumnae president suggested we have a provision for electronic fund-raising. There is a set-up fee in the range of \$250, a monthly statement charge that is rather sizable and a charge for each transaction. We would, of course, have to pass the costs through to each chapter who chooses to use this method of raising funds for their respective renovations.
