

## Irwin Family Foundation's \$1.75 Million Gift Creates Academic Center for Student Athletes at U of I

The former Sigma Pi chapter house which has also at times been home to Sigma Kappa, Delta Kappa Epsilon and lastly Kappa Alpha Psi at 402 E. Armory, Champaign, has become the new state of the art Irwin Academic Center. It is the first time academic resources for student-athletes have been in one place and centered on campus close to where students live and go to class.

The building, originally constructed as the Sigma Pi chapter house, in the 1920s has been extensively remodeled to house the academic center. The house was designed in 1920 by Joseph William Royer, who graduated from the University of Illinois in 1895 with a degree in architectural engineering and was the Urbana city engineer from 1898 to 1906. Royer was noted locally for his

Tudor Revival buildings three of which are or have been Greek chapter houses on this campus and one of which is presently Jumer's Hotel in Urbana,IL.

In the fall of 1999 the Preservation and Conservation Association of Champaign County gave the renovated Irwin Center an award for excellence in renovation. SPGH would like to add its kudos to the Irwin Center for saving an important part of the university's Greek heritage in a sensitive manner, thusly breathing new life into an historic structure and improving the fabric of the campus visual scene.

# Documenting Delta Tau Delta: U of I's Oldest Fraternity

In 1909, Iowa native Fred E. Berger entered the university of Illinois to study architecture. Shortly thereafter, he joined the Delta Tau Delta fraternity and, over the course of his student days, recorded his experiences in a scrapbook filled with mementos, photographs, dance programs, and news clippings concerning his fraternity activities. Berger's collection offers an invaluable glimpse into Uof I student life in the early twentieth century, but only a "snapshot" of Delta Tau Delta's 128-year history at Illinois.

In 1872, five years after the founding of the Illinois Industrial University(renamed Uof I in 1885), the Beta Upsilon chapter of Delta Tau Delta was organized in secret as the first fraternity on campus. In fact, the national fraternity, established in 1858, had pioneered the Greek system on a number of campuses, including Penn State(1872), Michigan State(1872), and Iowa State(1875). By 1876, the Delts presence at the Uof I was discovered by suspicious administrators who forced the chapter to withdraw its charter and go "underground." From 1881-91, the university administration required students to sign a "Iron Clad Pledge" in which they promised not to join any secret society.

Three years after the ban on "secret" societies was lifted, the Delta Tau Delta chapter openly reinstated it's charter.

Despite its significance, Delta Tau Delta's history is not well documented in the University Archives. In addition to the Berger scrapbook, the Archives holds limited copies of the chapter newsletter, <u>Beta Upsilon Booster</u>,(1911-43, 1966). Additional information must be gleaned from University faculty and administrative papers, student newspapers, UI histories, I-Books, Illios and student directories. In many instances, these sources fall short in documenting the contributions of fraternity and sorority chapters.

To provide a more comprehensive historical record, the *Society for the Preservation of Greek Housing (SPGH)* is sponsoring a fraternity and sorority chapter history project. Beginning this summer, the project will fund a graduate research assistant to write chapter histories for all Uof I social fraternities and sororities, past and present. SPGH member's histories will take first priority. These histories will be deposited in the Archives as well as with the chapter.


